



Trees for Barningham

Dear Ed,

As a relative newcomer to
Barningham, I've noticed a shortage
of trees and lack of continuous
hedgerows in some areas.
Continuous stretches of woodland
and hedgerow habitats are really
important for wildlife. They provide
diverse sources of food, extended
foraging ranges, shelter and
connection of populations – all
important for long term health and
survival.

I've been in contact with Trees for Teesdale and the Tees River Trust regarding support for tree and hedgerow planting. Both organisations are willing to support activities with us and there are additional sources of funding we can investigate as needed. All we need now are some interested landowners!

We can arrange for replacement of single trees or short hedgerow sections or work with you on larger schemes. Planting along field edges will not significantly reduce grazing land but will be very beneficial in extending and connecting local wildlife corridors.




