

Alternative?

It was a pleasure to travel around the outskirts of Bishop recently and to see how many of the road verges were now neither sprayed with vegicide (weedkiller) nor cut so that wild flowers and even some weeds are allowed to grow. This has the added benefit of not being able to see the litter and dog faeces that adorn the cut areas.

Many farmers now seem to be "rewilding" the edges of their fields leaving a conduit for wildlife, bees and especially hedgehogs, that is free from pesticide. The increase in "weeds" especially nettles, is said to be contributing to the increase in butterflies.

However this, on a much wider scale, brings up the problem of the non-selective herbicides, such as Glyphosate, which the UK wants to stop using in 2021 and the EEC in 2022. Monsanto have just settled a case in the US, brought by a groundsman who used it and claims it caused cancer. We have all probably used it at some time, sending the aerosol spray around the garden, and without wearing a mask. On the macro scale 5.4 million acres of farmland in the UK are treated annually and residues are now being found in bread and our plants are slowly becoming more resistant to Glyphosate.

Is there research on an alternative? I do hope so. Any advice on alternatives would be welcome.

Barningham's 42nd Flower and Produce Show

Sadly, this year we've taken the decision to cancel the Flower and Produce Show due to the uncertainty of the COVID-19 situation. We hope to resume next year. As a committee, and having taken feedback from the village, there is an appetite to come together as a community and we'd love to organise a socially distanced gathering, when the restrictions allow. If the current government guidelines change to allow a community event we are aiming to organise a Picnic on the Green on Sunday 6 September 2020, so that we can celebrate our community and enjoy our open spaces together. If we are able to go ahead you can bring your own picnic or there will be the option to order a pre-made picnic from Coghlans, or BBQ food from The Milbank Arms. We will provide more information about this if we are able to go ahead.

In the meantime, to recognise the time we would usually enjoy our village show together we would love as many Barningham residents as possible to display a homemade scarecrow between Friday 4 September 2020 - Monday 7 September 2020. Made to represent the theme - 2020 What A Year! We'd also encourage you to display, within your own gardens, the produce and your crafts from this year so your hard work isn't missed. Our expectation, and having taken feedback from other village scarecrow trails that took place during lockdown, is that this aspect will be able to continue regardless of the restrictions, so please join us and start preparing your scarecrow creations. It would be lovely for the children in the village, and all residents, to have a fun scarecrow trail to enjoy, and there might even be a prize for the villages favourite!

We're hopeful we'll be able to come together in a safe way in the near future and look forward to seeing the 2020 themed scarecrows in the village in early September.

Barningham Flower and Produce Show Committee

Attention all Newcomers (and anyone else)...

In response to Martha McBarron's letter of July 2020, as a newcomer to the village she will be unaware of the of the considerable conservation projects which have been undertaken by the Estate and its' tenants over the past 50 years. These projects include the planting of over 50 hectares of new woodlands; the protection of waterways; the creation of 6 wetland projects and 2 lakes; the planting of shelter belts, double hedges and amenity trees; the reseeding of upland hay meadows; the creation of black grouse habitats; the renovation of unused agricultural buildings and the rebuilding of miles of dry stone walls. These works have contributed to the Estate winning conservation awards and, earlier this year, being awarded by DEFRA one of the 200 countrywide Environmental Land Management scheme (ELMs) Test and Trials, aimed at informing the Government on the future environmental schemes for farmers. Over the next 4 years, as the UK transitions from the Common Agricultural Policy framework into ELMs, the farms on the Estate will be bringing forward new conservation projects to further enhance biodiversity. The Estate also looks forward to supporting the Barningham Net Zero project.

RAVENSWORTH VILLAGE HALL UPDATE

Work continues at the hall aimed at refurbishing the interior and upgrading the facilities. The recently completed new toilet area, funded by the National Lottery for All, Community Fund, is modern, clean and offers disabled access: pictures following the course of the project are available on the Ravensworth Village Website, at https://ravensworthvillage.wixsite.com/website

Replacement of the ageing metal windows in the toilet area by wooden, double glazed ones is due to take place shortly. Financial assistance, provided by a successful grant application to the RDC Community Investment Fund, means that the plan to remove the existing kitchen and replace it with a brand new one can be completed this Autumn. Prior to this the Hall ceiling will be repaired allowing the installation of new dimmable LED lighting and the walls will be replastered.






