married Mary Ware in the Parish of Kirby Ravensworth, Yorkshire in May 1792. Known children:

- John Woodward Born Gayles, Yorkshire in 1793. Died Richmond, Yorkshire, 1890.
- ii. / Ann Woodward Born Gayles, Yorkshire, 1794
- iii. / Mary Woodward Born Dalton, Yorkshire, 1796
- Jane Woodward Born Dalton, Yorkshire, 1798. Died Richmond, Yorkshire, 1891.

On William and Mary's marriage entry, in the Parish Records of Kirby Ravensworth, no job was noted for William but Mary was noted as being a spinster. William wrote his name in the record but Mary had signed with her mark, so presumably she couldn't write.

The villages of Gayles and Dalton are both in the Kirby Ravensworth Parish. Jane died aged 93 years. Her death was registered by Charles Hauxwell, the son of her niece Margaret Hauxwell. On her death certificate she was noted as being the daughter of William Woodward, brewer and inn keeper. Jane never married.
