- Spam texts: DO NOT REPLY and forward the text to 7726 to report it.
- · Cold calls about mobile upgrades and contracts: If you're unsure that the person calling you is an official representative of the company they claim to be from, hang up and do not reveal any personal information.

- Road Safety week: we have concentrated on low speed roads and 20mph zones, targetting areas outside schools to ensure the zig-zag lines aren't being misused during drop-off and pick-up times and that vehicles are adhering to the correct speed. 
