





REMOTE ACCESS SCAMS: often begin with a browser pop-up saying that your computer is infected with a virus, or maybe a call from someone claiming to be from your bank saying that they need to connect to your computer in order to cancel a fraudulent transaction on your account. Regardless of the narrative the fraudster's use, their goal is to steal your money or access your financial information by tricking you into allowing them to remotely connect to your computer. Only install software or grant remote access to your computer if you're asked by someone you know and trust, such as a friend or family member, and never as a result of an unsolicited call, browser pop up, or text message. Remember, a bank or service provider will never contact you out of the blue requesting remote access to your device.

FROM THE RICHMOND RURAL CRIME BULLETIN: During the month of March neighbourhood officers have been attending local schools and businesses to raise awareness of county lines. County lines is a form of criminal exploitation. It is when criminals befriend children, online or offline, then manipulate them into drug dealing. The 'lines' refer to mobile phones that are used to control a young person who is delivering drugs, often to more rural locations outside their home county.

County lines operations are often hard to spot, but the signs are visible. You might notice a child has multiple mobiles, comes home with unexplained injuries or bruising, suddenly has new trainers they can't afford. These could all be indicators that a young person is in trouble. We encourage everyone to learn the signs of exploitation and how to report it if worried.
