North Yorkshire police have a new community messenger / neighbourhood alert system where you will receive an email / text message making yourselves aware / updated about any police matters within the area, e.g. alerts of new scams or a crime such as a burglary within the area.

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH: SECURING YOUR E-MAIL ACCOUNT

Your email password: using a combination of 3 random words creates passwords that are long enough and strong enough. Avoid words that can be guessed, like your pet's name or birth month. Adding numbers and symbols is a good way to make your password even harder to guess.

Turn on 2-Step Verification (2SV) for your email: 2-Step Verification (2SV) gives you twice the protection so even if cyber criminals have your password, they can't access your email. It works by asking for more information to prove your identity. For example, getting a code sent to your phone when you sign in using a new device or change settings

such as your password. You won't be asked for this every time you check your email.
