Villagers keen on energy scheme

OVER 25 people attended a presentation at Barningham Parish Meeting about the Rural Communities Energy Fund which can be used to assess and design a cost-effective community renewable energy scheme.

The aim would be to reduce energy costs for village residents and generate surplus electricity to provide an income stream for the village, to fund energy efficiency improvements and other village projects.

Those present approved the plan to proceed with a grant application for a Phase 1 feasibility study, for which £40,000 can be applied. The application will be submitted by February 1, 2020.

Prior to the Parish Meeting, flyers about the project were distributed to all occupied houses in the village and discussions were held with residents in more than half of the properties. Villagers were overwhelmingly supportive of proceeding with the feasibility study. Further engagement will be undertaken in the coming weeks to provide input to the study plan and answer queries people may have.

A village team is forming to prepare the application and further community meetings are planned on December 11 and January 22. If you would like to get involved, please contact us (Tel. 621239 or marthamcbarron@outlook.com).



WHORLTON PARISH COUNCIL **Council in search** of a new clerk

AFTER many years of sterling service to the council, the clerk, Mr Jonathan Dickinson ,handed in his resignation at the meeting on November 19 due to pressure of work in his day job, but agreed to stay until a replacement is found.

After some confusion at the previous meeting about voting, councillors confirmed their earlier decision to object to the planning application for conversion of part of Whorlton pub into a dwelling and also asked the DCC to proceed with the moratorium on the sale of the pub as a community asset for six months, to enable the community to consider purchasing it.

The clerk also informed the council that the structural report on the state of the closed suspension bridge was imminent but he understood that the intention was to repair and reopen the bridge to traffic as soon as possible.


