





DCC Recycling

Recently Durham County Council presented how waste and recycling is treated at a Witham event organised by *Teesdale Action for Climate Transition*. No waste is sent to landfill any more – all materials are either recycled or used to generate electricity.

Black bin rubbish collections go to an Energy From Waste plant at Haverton Hill, which generates electricity. Residues from the plant are recycled as metal scrap and as an aggregate in breeze-block.

Recycling collections are taken to Washington, where the mixed materials are first checked over by pickers to remove non-recyclables. All accepted materials are turned into new products - even the plastic, which is being used to make window frames, garden furniture, bottles and thread!

Blue bin and glass box recycling must be clean, dry and loose! You can recycle:

- Plastic pots, tubs, trays and bottles. Squash plastic bottles and tetrapaks and replace the lids. Remove pumps from spray bottles.
- Cartons, cans, aerosols, metal lids and foil. Collect small foil and metal waste in a ball bigger than a 50p piece.
- Paper, window envelopes and cardboard but nothing with glitter or coatings.
- Glass bottles and jars. Metal sleeves and rings from screw caps can be left on - it is separated when the glass is crushed.

Items for the rubbish bin:

- · Dirty or bagged waste
- · Black plastic and plant pots
- · Crushable light plastics and crisp packets
- · Broken glass (for safety reasons), china and pyrex

WHORLTON PUB - A REPORT

Durham Planning Committee allowed permission for Whorlton pub to be divided in two. The annex, which has been used as a dining room, will be converted into a dwelling. The Parish Council opposed the application, and at the hearing on 20th February, the county councillors for Barnard Castle East area, George Richardson and James Rowlandson, spoke against the application. The applicant company, Geo A Carter Ltd, produced evidence that the pub would become more viable, if reduced in size by the removal of the annex. The Parish Council produced evidence that the pub would become less viable. Durham planning officers advised the Planning Committee councillors that the application must be allowed if the remaining pub could be viable. The Chairman was of the opinion that the loss of the annex, which will become a separate building, did not constitute the loss of a community asset. The majority vote went in favour of the applicant company.
