RAVENSWORTH VILLAGE HALL UPDATE

Improvement work is ongoing with repairs to the ceiling and replastering of the walls. During recent work a date stone was uncovered on the north wall of the original building, which was for many years the village primary school (see photo above right).

The original hall was the school classroom, and a further extension was later added to the north - the current location of the entrance porch and reception area. The primary school occupied the building until the 1960s. An archive photograph from the later years is shown

Thank you to all who supported our bridle-path petition. Your support was gratefully appreciated, and a letter has been sent to NYCC. We will keep you posted on

Christine Taylor and I met with Ian Beighton (NYCC Highways) and Councillor Thompson on 13 Oct to discuss the top road from Richmond between the junction for Reeth/Feldom and The Whashton/Kirby Hill Junction. It was a very productive meeting with several solutions discussed. Hopefully we will get road markings and some additional signage to help with the road safety on that stretch soon.

On a sadder note our objections against hedgerow removal were rejected and planning was passed for removal of over 500m of hedgerows with no clause for replanting. The process of removal of the hedgerows was in action at the end of Oct. Caroline Walton (Planning Officer) has agreed to send a short report to the Parish meeting. An officer from RDC is coming into the village on 14 November to assess some trees for Tree Preservation Orders so we can try and ensure the future of some our landscape. Sally Zaranko







BARNINGHAM PARISH MEETING

Because of restrictions resulting from the Covid 19 pandemic it has not been possible to hold either the Annual Parish Meeting in the spring or the Finance Meeting this autumn, both of which are open to all residents of the village, in their normal format. The Finance Meeting in November 2019 set the precept for 2020/21 at £3,650, a figure equivalent to around £44.30 for the average (Band D) property in the Parish. To decide the precept for the next financial year, and in view of the current restrictions on meeting face-to-face, it is proposed to hold an online meeting via Zoom, open to all residents.
