

The Slow Ways Project - this project was set up by Dan Raven-Ellison who is a geographer and explorer. His goal is to plot more than 4,000 walking routes on an online map using the 200,00km of footpaths and bridleways that trace their way between village, town

and city. Unlike national trails and historic long-distance walks, the Slow Ways will not divert to local beauty spots or local point of interest, Slow Ways will be typically less that 20km and wherever possible pass through a village every 5km or so. These will be plotted on the Ordnance Survey OS Maps Platform. Each Slow Way will be named by the settlements it connects.
