




- HMRC scam: beware scam text messages or e-mails purporting to be from HMRC they tell you that you have a pending amount due which will expire on a particular date, then asks you to click on a link to claim the amount back. These scam texts and email often look very real
- · Lottery and Prize Draw Scams: claim that you have won a large sum of money and may ask you to pay a small fee in order to access the funds. Why not re-gift your scam email and send it to the Friends Against Scams Team to deal with - find out how to do this on the Friends Against Scams website: http://www.friendsagainstscams.org.uk/scamnesty

...and from Richmond's Helenor Gwatkin (Rural Policing Team):

- We have been made aware of several Land Rover thefts in the Cleveland and Darlington areas. Please could you all ensure that you remain vigilant and ensure that your vehicles are secure.
- · We are still experiencing high volumes of calls and incidents with poachers and farm equipment thefts. Please report anything suspicious. Even if the event has happened we need to be made aware. If people are on the land suspiciously please call 999.
- We are continuing to patrol with the "Border Watch" volunteers, and demonstrating excellent collaborative working. We have had some fantastic results and thank the support of locals/volunteers.

Ravensworth's Respectful Reminders

Ravensworth is fortunate to have a large village green and the Parish Council is charged with looking after it. The tracks around The Green were constructed for horses and carts but are also well suited for bikes and pedestrians. Vehicles are tolerated but drivers are required to do no more than 5 mph and should aim to stay on the track. There are signs at the entries to the tracks clearly stating No Through Road; the tracks are private roads to be used for access only, i.e. by residents or for deliveries, and **not as short cuts**. The wear and tear of the tracks and the grass adjacent to them are constant sources of concern and expenditure for the community.

Walking in and around the village is a popular pursuit for both residents and visitors. Unfortunately, paths and grass have once again become treacherous to tread upon as dog waste becomes more prevalent. Responsible dog owners collect their pets' waste and then dispose of it in the appropriate bin – there are three dog waste bins in and around the village. Heavily laden small black plastic bags hanging from trees and bushes are not a welcome decoration even in the festive season.


